Four Storytellers:

- 1) Data
- 2) Staff
- 3) Alumni
- 4) The Participant



# WE NEED TO CHANGE WHICH STORIES GET AIRTIME

Tactic: help them tell a different story

- a) Redefine skills
- b) Help them tell their story to an employer
- c) Reframe the employment path

# CENTER PARTICIPANTS & DEFINE HANDER BOOKES SET At the Center

What does their journey look like? Who does what? Where do people "drop out?"

How "Warm" are Your Handoffs?

Is it just a name and a phone number?
When was the last time you updated your contact list?



## CENTER PARTICIPANTS & DEFINE HANDONFEMPROPONDES. Sne next step

One map: show the journey from intake

One owner: define the lead/conductor

One next step: every appearance ends with a small next step the participant controls

# FORMS OF SUPPORT DON'T ALWAYS COSTELLAND WINS

Zero-cost: judge praise, alumni shoutouts, clear ladder plans, warm handoffs, celebrating often

Low-cost: bus passes, ID fees, interview clothes, phone cards

Higher-cost: peer coaching hours, credential and training dollars, housing assistance

# PROOF FROM THE FIELD



### THESE TACTICS ALREADY WORK

#### Other FTCs and TCs

Buffalo Opioid Court – deaths fell over 41% from 2017 - 2018

- Immediate linkage to MAT
- Daily judicial check ins
- Peer support

Sacramento County FTC – since 2007, over 98% of kids at home at enrollment stayed home

- Peer coaches
- CPS coordination
- Family centered services



### THESE TACTICS ALREADY WORK

### **ESD**

- Embedding employment services in prisons and jails
- Training staff how to assist with storytelling, career mapping, and resource referrals

### Recovery and Reentry Community Circles

- In 6 weeks, over 40% of participants found work
- 100% reported less isolation and more confidence in telling their story to an employer
- Most valuable part was delivered at no cost by Toastmasters
